## Fun Food Facts You Wish You Knew

Food has a wonderful way of breaking down boundaries and bringing people together. Wherever in the world you travel, there is no better way to learn about a new destination than by dining shoulder to shoulder with the locals. The dishes may be different, the ingredients unfamiliar, but by sharing mealtime moments, guests can discover the genuine heart and soul of their hosts.

Nowhere is this more evident than in Asia. Cuisine is woven into the fabric of countries all across this captivating continent. But every culture has its own culinary quirks that uninitiated travellers might not be aware of.

As the saying goes, "When in Rome, do as the Romans do", and when in Asia, eat as the locals eat. Whether you're enjoying a casual street-side bite or a grand celebratory feast, here are a few fun facts to help maximise your dining pleasure.

## Hong Kong

★ **Fun Fact:** Dim sum means "to touch the heart" (Chinese characters: 點心)

Dim sum was originally served as a snack in teahouses along the ancient Silk Road. From these humble beginnings, the joy of these bite-sized dishes has spread around the world. Usually steamed in bamboo baskets, dim sum comes in an amazing array of flavours and can be enjoyed

at any time of day. The price of dishes can vary too; in Hong Kong, dim sum can be served in Michelin-starred restaurants or from curb-side hawker stalls. Whichever option guests choose, make sure you savour the experience – every piece of dim sum should touch your heart!

## Malaysia

Malaysia is a wonderfully diverse country where many different culinary cultures come together to create unique dining experiences. One of the most distinctive local customs is eating with one's hands. According to Hindu beliefs, the hands are responsible for feeding and the fingers represent

each of the five elements. Visitors should not miss the chance to try Nasi Kandar, a popular rice dish that derives from biriyani, which was brought to Malaysia by Indian traders. Try pinching pieces of food together with the fingers of your right hand, without letting it touch your palm.
